



USAID Democratic Governance East

USAID's Democratic Governance East (DG East) is a new five-year activity to improve trust and confidence between citizens and government in eastern Ukraine, contributing to USAID's broader strategic objective of mitigating the impacts of Russia's aggression.

Activity timeframe: October 1, 2018 - September 30, 2023.

OBJECTIVES:

Confidence

Greater citizen confidence in and understanding of key reforms.

Participation

Increased participation in community problem-solving. Diversified citizen engagement with inclusive and democratic civic values.

Implementation Principles

DG East aims to strengthen the connection and trust between citizens and their government in eastern Ukraine by promoting good governance and an inclusive civic identity, increasing interaction between citizens and civil society, and increasing collaboration between government and citizens and citizen participation in community development and local decision-making.
